Chicago, IL (May 23, 2017): Larry Buie, PharmD BCOP FASHP, took office as an at Large Member of the Board of Directors of Hematology/Oncology Pharmacy Association (HOPA) at the recent 13<sup>th</sup> HOPA Annual Conference in March. Dr. Buie has been an active member of HOPA since 2006, and most recently served as a member of the Council on Continuing Education. Prior to that he was the chair of the Program Committee. Dr. Buie has always been interested in education and has served as a faculty member at the UNC Eshelman School of Pharmacy and the South Carolina College of Pharmacy. Dr. Buie has made multiple contributions to the medical literature and routinely provides continuing education to pharmacists in a variety of settings. He has been a Board Certified Oncology Pharmacist since 2008 and is a Fellow of the American Society of Health-Systems Pharmacists.

Dr. Buie received his Doctor of Pharmacy degree from the University of North Carolina Eshelman School of Pharmacy in Chapel Hill, NC in 2005. He completed both his PGY1
